I am grateful to live in a country where eye banks are commonplace and people sacrificially donate their loved ones' eyes (please remember to pray for the grieving family that is making this transplant possible!).

is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid. The Lord, the Lord himself, is my strength and my defense; he has become my salvation.
